CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLARSHIP FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Students who have demonstrated exemplary academic performance in their undergraduate and graduate studies are eligible to apply. Students must have earned an accumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher in post secondary studies. Honors and recognition received from colleges, societies, honoraries and other organizations for academic achievement will be a major consideration. A limited number of awards based on relative applicant merit will be considered for both new students and existing Basic Sciences students who satisfy this criterion. This annual Scholarship of \$3,000 is conditional upon maintaining a GPA of 3.5 or higher during your participation in the Basic Sciences.

WISNESKI FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FOR WOMEN IN MEDICINE

Women play an increasingly integral role in the field of medicine, not only adding the unique perspectives they bring as daughters, mothers and traditional care givers, but by sheer demographics helping to satisfy a shortfall of doctors that would otherwise not be met. Applicants must express how as future female physicians they plan to influence trends in medicine related to women of all ages. Newly admitted female students to the University of Sint Eustatius School of Medicine are eligible to apply. The scholarship provides a \$2,000 annual tuition award.

PAUL ALLEN KNOPF SCHOLARSHIP FOR COMMUNITY SERVICE

Compassion and service are essential components of being a doctor. These same values are exhibited by a commitment to community service. Applicants for this scholarship should be able to demonstrate how their past experiences, work and achievements have enabled them to model their lives with a sense of service to humanity, and how their envisioned futures as physicians will continue to embody these core values. Newly admitted and existing students at the University of Sint

Eustatius School of Medicine are eligible to apply. The scholarship carries an annual award of \$3,000 towards tuition and fees and is renewable throughout the full program provided an accumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher is maintained and evidence of continued community service is demonstrated.

SINT EUSTATIUS SCHOLARSHIP FOR SERVING THE UNDERSERVED

There is a growing disparity in the availability of trained health care professionals between affluent and underdeveloped parts of the world. Even a country such as the United States has areas in which there are shortages of physicians; even severe shortages in some medical specialties. Our University aspires to motivate young doctors to serve those patient populations that are less advantaged and remain underserved. Candidates for this award must demonstrate through their past experiences, community involvement and/or volunteer work that they are committed to serving the underserved and must be able to express how, as physicians, they will serve these populations in the future. This scholarship for newly admitted students to the University carries a \$2,500 annual award and is renewable through the Basic Sciences provided a GPA of 3.0 or higher is maintained. Students who have completed the Basic Sciences, successfully passed USMLE Step 1 (first attempt), and who accept clinical clerkships in areas designated as Underserved by the University will also be eligible for consideration.

WORLD HEALTH SCHOLARSHIP FOR CULTURAL COMPETENCE

The faculty and students of the University of Sint Eustatius are a reflection of the world as it exists today: a world rich with cultural, ethnic, racial and religious diversity. Furthermore, the University is dedicated to training physicians whose understanding of diverse cultural traditions enables them to exercise greater clinical skill in the doctor-patient relationship and whose world view prepares them to be global healers. This scholarship award of \$1,000 per year is renewable provided an accumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher is maintained.

NEW HORIZONS SCHOLARSHIP FOR ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

There are many paths to healing and many professionals who have served patients with the same commitment and dedication in their respective professions that physicians have brought to the practice of medicine. The University of Sint Eustatius School of Medicine recognizes the importance of Allied Health Professionals and the significant roles they play in an integrative approach to individual health. Eligibility for this scholarship is limited to newly admitted students who have served as licensed practitioners in other fields of health care. Having decided to pursue the M.D. degree, application for the scholarship should include a statement expressing how past practice as a health care professional, and envisioned future as a doctor of medicine, will be enhanced by the integration of the knowledge, wisdom and perspective of the combined fields. This scholarship for \$1,000 per trimester is renewable if a GPA of 3.0 or higher is maintained throughout the course of study. Though eligibility for this scholarship is generally confined to newly admitted students to the Basic Sciences Curriculum, special consideration for awards will also be given to continuing New Horizon Scholarship recipients who have completed their Basic Sciences with an accumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, successfully passed USMLE Step 1 (first attempt), and who pursue clinical clerkships at sites specifically designated by the Chancellor as pursuing excellence in integrative medicine.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR SERVICE TO YOUR COUNTRY

In recognition of dedicated service in the armed forces the University is proud to grant a scholarship to military veterans who have served unselfishly to protect the freedom and rights of their country. We are honored to provide military personnel with a scholarship to assist in the fulfillment of their personal dreams and aspirations to study the art of medicine. This scholarship award of \$1,000 per year is renewable provided an accumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher is maintained.

GUIDELINES:

Students must submit an application with separate essays for each scholarship outlining their academic successes and challenges, community service, and/or professional achievements prior to attending medical school. Each essay should be no more than 500 words and must be accompanied by supporting documents such as transcripts, letters of recommendation, certificates, awards and additional proof of eligibility if necessary.

DEADLINES:

⌘ The Scholarship Committee must receive all applications and supporting documentation at least four weeks prior to the start of the semester.

⌘ Scholarship recipients will be notified within two weeks of the Committee's decision.

DISCLAIMER:

⌘ Scholarships are awarded on an annual (3 trimester) basis unless specified otherwise.

⌘ Please note that no student is guaranteed a scholarship and the number of scholarships awarded per semester may vary.

⌘ All Scholarship Committee decisions are final and are not open to appeal.

HELPFUL TIPS & FACTS:

⌘ Scholarships are not automatically renewed and requalification is not guaranteed. Recipients must resubmit all scholarship applications on an annual basis.

⌘ You will not receive money directly. Money will be sent to the school in the form of a credit towards tuition and fees.

⌘ If you are unclear about the scholarship application process, the Financial Aid department is available to answer your questions.

⌘ Prior to submitting your scholarship application be sure to include all necessary supporting documentation. Missing items and/or information will delay the process.
